Heaving Sidewalks?

There are areas in our neighborhood where heaving sidewalks are a danger to others. Please be reminded that it is the **responsibility of the property owner to maintain the sidewalk** abutting their property in a good and safe condition.

If your sidewalk is in need of repair, please consider fixing it this spring or summer. FIA Board has secured a contractor who is willing to do pieces, parts of sidewalks and small jobs at a reduced rate.

Paris Brothers Concrete have indicated that pricing would be \$4.25/ square foot, but that could be reduced with number

of participants. For example, if you have a 5 ft. x 6 ft. piece of sidewalk that is raised or in need of repair, the price would be \$127.50. It is also advised to replace at least two pieces to correct a hazardous walkway. Larger jobs, patios, and driveways are also welcomed.

The contractor will work with City regarding permits and arborist concerns. The contractor will complete neighborhood work in a specific time frame and bill customers individually.
